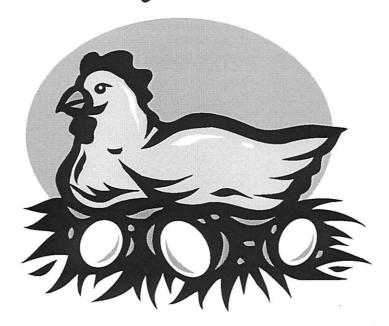

Instructions for Poultry Record Book Completion

The Rutherford County 4-H Poultry Record Book is for 4-H members who wish to be recognized in peer competition for outstanding project work. Completion of this book is also one of the requirements that must be fulfilled for the return of your "chick chain" deposit. These instructions are to help in the completion of the record book. An electronic copy of this project record book may be obtained from you 4-H Agent.

The record book should include the sections as listed in the table of contents and be assembled in following order:

1. Cover

Please use a stiff 8½ x 11 inch binder.

2. Table of Contents

On a single sheet of paper list the sections of your record book. These sections should be:

- A. Rutherford County 4-H Poultry Project Plan-Thinking Ahead
- B. Rutherford County 4-H Poultry Project Record Worksheets
- C. Rutherford County 4-H Poultry Project Mortality and Depletion Worksheet
- D. Pullet Growing Financial Statement
- E. Rutherford County 4-H Poultry Project Essay

Describe the highlights of your project. Write about preparing to bring your chicks home, what it was like to watch them grow, how you took care of the birds, and what you learned through caring for them. Be sure to indicate profits, losses or savings if something done in the project saved you or your family money. Write about any educational activities that you attended during your project. These could include tours, conferences, workshops, judging events, project groups, skill-a-thons or any other event related to this project. Essay should be no less than one page and no more than three pages.

F. Pictures

Photographs should be included to illustrate the highlights of the poultry project. They may be individual photos or a photo sequence. They may show honors and recognition received, special practices followed and start-to-finish progress. Photographs must be limited to three $8\frac{1}{2} \times 11$ inch pages. Pictures should be mounted flat to the page with a caption describing what is taking place in the photograph. Photographs should not be shingled and should appear only on one side of the page. Do *NOT* enclose the project pictures in plastic sleeves.

G. Other Related Records

This is a good place to put receipts, activity pages, workshop notes, calendar entries, etc.

H. Rutherford County 4-H Poultry Project Plan- Looking Back

A division page should be made for each section. Tabs may be used on these division pages to help in locating the different sections. The tabs should be recessed inside the portfolio cover to prevent tabs from tearing off in handling.

All forms should be legible. No extra credit is to be given because the forms are typed. All reported records should be from current project dates (March-August of current year)

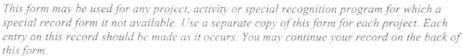
