



EXTENSION'S FORAGE PLOTS

Forages are plants eaten by livestock (cattle, horses, sheep, goats, llamas, etc.) and wildlife. These can be grasses and/or legumes.

Our forage plots are 10 by 30 foot areas (with three replications), planted to demonstrate different species and cultivars so that livestock and/or hay producers may evaluate them for use in their operation. Tonnage produced and nutrient quality are measured, and different management techniques for maximum forage quality (nutritional content) and production are also demonstrated. It's a great way for a producer to actually see and touch a forage before purchasing seed. Seed is expensive, and I frequently tell producers that if it's a "new thing" and they're unsure, let us grow it for them first—and let US take the risk for them.

What is happening in May? One word: PLANTING! The winter cover crop of crimson clover has been terminated in preparation for planting, and be on the lookout for freshly planted plots. What are we planting?

- Ray's Crazy Mix (a summer cover crop blend)-this area will be converted to cool season forage plots in the fall.
- Mojo Crabgrass
- Korean Lespedeza
- AU Grazer Sericea Lespedeza
- Dessie Teff
- Red River Crabgrass
- Laredo Bermudagrass
- Wrangler Bermudagrass

And possibly more!
