Andra has been a Master Gardener in Rutherford County since 2022. She is the project leader of the demonstration rain garden at Lane Agri-Park, which won a Conservation Promotion Award from the

Tennessee Association of Conservation Districts in June of 2024. The rain garden also won the prestigious "Search for Excellence" award for best teaching site at the 2024 Tennessee Extension Master Gardener state conference, where it was lauded for providing a real world example of a rain garden that can be replicated at home, helping to reduce the negative impacts of land use change. Since moving to Tennessee, Andra has shifted her focus to plant conservation after learning about the globally rare plants native to the Nashville area. Her interest in native plants started as a way to attract birds to her yard, in order to take pictures for her Instagram account, @goodfriendofbirds. Andra now rescues and propagates many native plants, which she donates to the Wild Ones organization and the Murfreesboro Indigenous Plant increasing the availability of local-ecotype plants for gardeners and plant restorations in the Nashville Basin physiographic region.
