September is **National Suicide Prevention Month,** a time dedicated to raising awareness, remembering those lost to suicide, and offering support to those who are struggling.

The overall theme of Suicide Prevention Month is that suicide is preventable and everyone can play a role in saving lives. You can offer support by:

- Become aware of the warning signs. These can include talking about feeling hopeless or being a burden, withdrawing from loved ones, expressing rage, or giving away prized possessions.
- Ask and listen. If you are concerned about someone, ask them directly if they are thinking about suicide. Studies show that asking in a caring way can be a relief, not a trigger. Then, listen to them without judgment.
- Offer support and help them connect with resources. Express your concern and let them know that help is available. Don't leave them alone if you believe they are at immediate risk.
- Take advantage of training. Organizations offer workshops and training, such as Mental Health First Aid, to teach people how to help someone in a mental health crisis.
- Join a walk. Organizations like the <u>American Foundation for Suicide Prevention (AFSP)</u> host "Out of the Darkness Walks" to raise funds for research and prevention programs.

If you or someone you know needs help:

- Call or text 988 to reach the National Suicide and Crisis Lifeline for free, confidential support 24/7.
- Visit the 988 Lifeline website at 988lifeline.org to learn more and get help through their chat service.
- Utilize the Crisis Text Line by texting HOME to 741741 from anywhere in the U.S.
- Visit the websites of suicide prevention organizations like AFSP and the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) for additional resources.
